Welcome to the Sparks Auctions Autumn 2025 sale!

We are pleased to present our Autumn 2025 auction, which brings together an impressive array of stamps and postal history from Canada, British North America, and the world. Canadian philately is represented by high-quality singles and an attractive offering of die proofs, complemented by a striking group of modern errors and varieties. Postal history collectors will note highly desirable Pence, Decimal, and Small Queen issue frankings, while British North America includes scarce British Columbia, alongside strong Newfoundland Airmails highlighted by a never hinged Columbia Flight single and signatures of aviation pioneers Raynham, Hawker, Grieve, Alcock, and Brown.

Canadian revenues are particularly strong, led by Part II of the extraordinary “Simone Collection,” with Supreme Court and War Savings rarities, as well as seldom-seen “IN PRIZE” usages on document. Our British Commonwealth and worldwide sections are equally compelling, with noteworthy Crimean War mail, Chinese stamps and covers, an in-depth study of Great Britain Line Engraved, a continued offering of India postal history, and a diverse selection of first issues from around the globe. Worldwide postal history continues to be a strength, with a diverse range comprising items from the seventeenth century onwards, including military mail, Zeppelins, advertising, rare frankings, and much more. In contrast to our past format, this auction presents stamps and postal history together rather than in separate sections, allowing collectors to more easily locate material of interest.

Our popular Lots and Collections section once again offers a wealth of opportunities for collectors and dealers alike, ranging from small selections of classic stamps to intact holdings and major properties. Among the highlights are a superb collection of Canada’s Admiral Issues, an elegant exhibit of the 1934 3c Cartier, strong Great Britain holdings with plating studies and postal history including a desirable assembly of Penny Reds with Maltese Cross cancellations, a specialised Gold Coast collection, powerful collections of Canada, and further studies of first issues of the world. As always, these lots are supported by thousands of high-quality online images, with many larger lots also accompanied by detailed video walkthroughs.

Looking ahead, our next sale will be our December Worldwide Postal History auction, which will feature a diverse selection ranging from Admiral postal history of Canada to early Zeppelin mail and signed pioneer aviator mail. We continue to welcome consignments for our Winter 2026 sale, and invite discussions both for consignment and outright purchase of collections.

- 1     ☉ **4 1852-57, 3d red Beaver on wove, vertical strip of five**, four close to very large margins, cancelled by four crisp strikes of concentric rings, pressed creases including a paper split in the fourth stamp, an extremely scarce and impressive multiple with strong visual appeal. **Estimate C\$1,500**
- 2     ☉ **4vii 1852, 3d red Beaver with major re-entry**, on wove paper, four ample well-balanced margins, deep colour, centrally-struck by black target cancel, leaving distinctive features of the position 47, Pane A re-entry, a desirable example, very fine; with 2022 Richard Gratton AIEP certificate. **Unitrade C\$1,300**
- 3     ☉ **5 1855, 6d slate grey Consort**, imperforate used, with dramatic pre-printing paper fold pressed out, cut to outer framelines on all sides, quite striking, such folds rarely encountered on Pence issues; with 2024 Greene Foundation certificate. **Estimate C\$500**



- 4     ✉ **7 1856 (September 27), Cobourg to England, folded entire endorsed 'per British & N.A. R.M.S.P. sailing,'** carried aboard the Asia, franked at the British Packet rate by 1852-57 10d blue Cartier, with mostly good to enormous margins, just touching at foot but showing portion of adjoining stamp at right, tied by a superb large Cobourg c.d.s. which leaves the portrait virtually clear, with red PAID arrival c.d.s. (14 Oct) alongside and Kingston (28 Sep) backstamp, two vertical filing folds clear of stamp, scarce in this quality and desirable with the 10d cancelled by c.d.s., a most attractive cover. **Unitrade C\$3,000**



- 5  **8 1858 (March 1), 1/2d deep rose horizontal strip of six on folded cover from Newboro to Ottawa**, paying the 3d single letter rate, the strip with margins close to large except just touched at left of stamp 1 and slightly in on stamp 4, tied by three crisp target cancels with Newboro despatch c.d.s. at lower left and backstamped with City of Ottawa / U.C. arrival c.d.s. (3 Mar), a couple of unobtrusive filing folds affecting stamps 1 and 5, yet an important and extremely rare showpiece of exceptional visual appeal, one of only twelve covers recorded with this franking, of which just two bear intact strips of six; ex Nickle (Firby Auctions, 29 Oct 1988, lot 388), de Volpi, and Jarrett.

The challenge was ultimately won by Alcock and Brown, who successfully completed the crossing in a Vickers Vimy from St. John's to Clifden, Ireland on 14-15 June, marking a triumph of early aviation and cementing Newfoundland's pivotal role in transatlantic flight history. Alcock & Brown were knighted by King George V, and celebrated as global aviation pioneers.

*Only 300 examples of the 35¢ Caribou stamp were overprinted to commemorate the transatlantic flight of the Miss Columbia, a Bellanca monoplane piloted by Captain J. Erroll Boyd and Lieutenant Harry P. Connor, who departed Harbour Grace, Newfoundland, with the aim of completing a non-stop transatlantic flight from Newfoundland to England. At the urging of the postmaster, a bag of mail was carried aboard the flight; 48 stamps were reserved for covers posted at Harbour Grace, with a further eight stamps (two blocks of four) given to the pilots. The remaining stamps were placed on sale at the St. John's post office on 25 September 1930. Of the original 300 examples, approximately 100 are believed to have been used on cover, and many of those remaining of the balance lack the freshness of the example offered here.*

7. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs and carry appropriate insurance. See [Shipping Information](#) below for Sparks Auctions’ shipping policies.

8. Because the auction catalogue is available in multiple formats (print, online at sparks-auctions.com, at StampAuctionNetwork.com and Philasearch.com ) there is a possibility of technical or other error. In that event **the auctioneer’s decision will be final.** If discovered before the sale, corrections will be posted on www.sparks-auctions.com These are only provided as a service to bidders and Sparks Auctions does not guarantee their completeness or accuracy. See [Valuation of Lots](#) for an overview of Sparks Auctions’ use of catalogue values and estimates.

9. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned to us within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. **The following lots may not be returned for any reason:**

- a) Lots containing five or more items;
- b) Any lot described with “faults”, “flaws”, or “defects” may not be returned because of any fault, flaw or defect;
- c) Lots illustrated in our printed catalogue or online may be returned because of centring, margins or other factors



shown in the illustrations, including easily visible flaws. It is the bidder's responsibility to view lot images online before bidding;

- d)** Any lot that was viewed in advance of the auction by the buyer or his agent;
- e)** Any lot sent for expertization by Sparks that receives numerical grading unless the graded certificate describes faults not already described by us;
- f)** It is normal for postal history items to have small faults including but not limited to minor nicks, pencil notations on back, edge and back flap tears, and slight reductions consistent with commercial usage. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. While we strive to mention more significant flaws, condition issues such as the aforementioned are not grounds for return. Items being offered primarily on the basis of the postmark are not returnable on the basis of flaws to the underlying item.

**10.** All lots are sold as genuine, unless otherwise noted. If a purchaser wishes to obtain an expert opinion on a lot, an extension for expertization may be granted provided that the following conditions are met:

- a)** Notice of this intent is given prior to finalizing the purchase;
- b)** All lots to be sent out on extension must be paid in advance, including the expertizing fee(s), and shall be submitted by Sparks, directly. Sparks will use one of the following expertizing services:
  - i)** Vincent Graves Greene Foundation (Canada and BNA); or
  - ii)** BPA or RPSL (British Commonwealth); or
  - iii)** Philatelic Foundation or PSE (USA and territories); or
  - iv)** Another authority mutually agreeable to both parties.
- c)** Extensions are granted for the reasonable period of time required by the expertizing authority;
- d)** If in the opinion of the authority the lot is not genuine or was grossly misdescribed, the purchaser shall receive a full reimbursement of the purchase price including the expertization fee;
- e)** If a purchased item has a recognized certificate dated within the last seven years, extensions will not usually be granted.

**11.** All lots are subject to a minimum bid (reserve), below which the lot will not be sold. Any lots which do not meet this minimum bid will be declared to have been "passed."

**12.** Sparks Auctions, its shareholders, directors, employees, and contractors reserve the right to bid on and purchase lots as principal.

**13.** Should any dispute arise over these Terms and Conditions, such dispute will be settled according to the laws and regulations of the Province of Ontario, Canada, with options for resolution being negotiation between the parties, followed by mediation, followed by action in the most appropriate legal venue in Ontario.

### Shipping Information

Local residents may arrange for pick-up from our office by appointment only.

Items will be shipped using the most economical method, including tracking and/or signature upon delivery, unless alternate arrangements are made with Sparks Auctions before shipping. Buyers are solely responsible for insuring shipped items. Buyers outside Canada are responsible for all customs duties, import fees, sales taxes or any other charges assessed by their home country or any intermediaries.

Shipping methods are subject to the current regulations and protocols of the shipping provider, which may change over time due to external factors beyond Sparks Auctions' control. Single or multiple lots will be shipped with no additional handling, packaging, or insurance fees. However, cartons and larger lots may incur extra handling or packaging charges.

To improve shipping efficiency and reduce costs for buyers, some lots may be shipped without multi-ring binders or other bulky housing mentioned in their descriptions. In some cases, the contents of multiple housings may be consolidated into fewer containers.

- VF very fine** a stamp in superior condition which is well-centred and without fault.
- F-VF fine-very fine** applied to stamps that are somewhat less well-centred than very fine, while taking into account what may be considered as typical margins of classic material. The term has also been applied to multiples with individual stamps with range of grade or for larger lots/collections.
- F fine** stamps having perforations that do not cut into the design and without damaging faults. Items described as such may have slight detracting features such as short perforation tips or natural inclusion. Much classic material naturally falls into this category and may be expected to command prices similar to those ascribed by catalogue values.
- VG very good** equivalent to “average”. Typically with poor centring, heavy cancellation or faults such as minor thins, light creases, etc.
- ✉ **cover** includes stampless folded letters (SFL), envelopes, first day covers (FDC’s), stationery envelopes, etc.
- PC post card** applies to picture postcards, postal cards, stationery cards, etc.
- E/P essay, proof, die proof**
- UL upper left** usually used to describe the corner of a sheet, block or individual stamp. The abbreviations UR, LR and LL are used similarly.
- c.d.s. circular date stamp** postmark
- l.h. lightly hinged**
- v.l.h. very lightly hinged**
- h.r. hinge remnant**
- perf. perforation** used in the context of “short perfs” or a perforation measurement, such as “perf. 12.0 x 11.5”

## Valuation of Lots

Catalogue values are listed for many lots in the sale. These are the best available guides to the retail price of a single stamp or set provided that the item(s) are the same quality as the standard described in the introduction to each catalogue. Exceptional quality will often sell above the catalogue value; inferior quality will sell for less; faulty stamps in a lot can result in a sale price of a small percentage of the catalogue price.

When cataloguing collections, we use the value for the grade specified. For Scott this grade is very fine. For Unitrade we use the grade specified in the lot’s description. Thus a “fine” collection will have all stamps added at the fine price. We do not count obvious forgeries, reprints, etc. and usually do not count faulty or ugly stamps. A lightly penciled X under a stamp in a lot means it was not counted in the catalogue value. We put a light pencil note beside more expensive stamps and often put a total catalogue value at the bottom of each page to assist viewers.

The *U.S. Specialized* and the *Scott Classic* are referred to as “Scott” interchangeably with the standard 6 volumes.

The term “owner’s catalogue value” indicates a variety of approaches and may include older versions of catalogues. We will have inspected and reviewed the result but not re-catalogued; hence we do not vouch for the exact total of an “owner’s catalogue value”. Likewise, we will note “owner-identified” or “owner’s count” or “owner’s face value” when there are varieties or other notations included in the consignment, even if we have not verified them.

“Estimates” are used when there are multiple factors to consider, to identify what we believe the lot might sell for when there is reasonable competition for it.

“Face Value” is used for entire lots when it best describes the value of the contents. From time to time, “face value” is used to identify the face value of a portion of a lot that also considers additional factors.

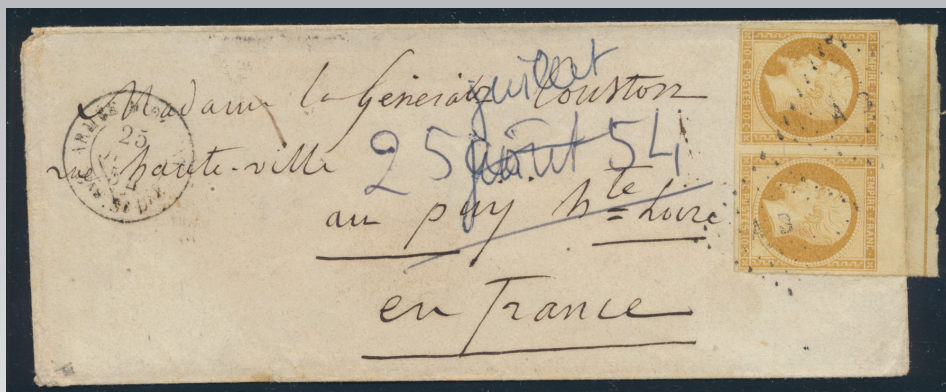
